Objective: To diminish the differences between Pupils especially our disadvantaged pupils in their outcomes by removing barriers to progress and inspiring engagement for all pupils with targeted focus upon Pupil Premium children..

Winston Way Pupil Premium Strategy:

- 1) have the highest expectations for each child - no excuses!
- 2) to identify and prioritise the disadvantaged
- 3) to track them as a separate group so that even though we are aspirational for all ; we are doubly aspirational for them
- 4) to compensate by helping them by paying for at least one after-school/extra-curricular club
- 5) give them priority and free places in our breakfast club
- 6) focus those who work as mentors or in pastoral roles (including the school receptionist as a welcoming face) to be aware of their needs and report any concerns (as we would for any child; but doubly focussed) to HT
